Description	Flask, also known as a small flask or ointment bottle. It is a small cylindrical vessel with a cylindrical body and a well-developed truncated cone-shaped foot, and a mouth with a curved lip at the top. The vessel is held in place by a ribbon handle that starts at the shoulders.
